The "odds" are varied in these skillfully written tales. An obstacle to one's success or happiness may lie in one's own character or the prejudice of someone else. A potential employer may cast a suspicious eye on an individual's background. A guardian seems reluctant to sponsor any further education for his charge. Other characters here are looking as much for increased self-respect as financial reward or better training. Set in locales as varied as Ontario, Saskatchewan, and Prince Edward Island, the stories of Against the Odds are peopled with orphans, teachers, actors, struggling single-parent families, intransigent relatives. It's a world, though distant from our own, where Montgomery's characters have problems similar to ours, and their methods of solving them are not very different from what we would try. When I left the children's home, I promised myself that I would have nothing to do with them, I was sure that my only chance of living a good life would be to put the past behind me, even though that meant saying goodbye to some of the people I loved the most - as well as the ones I hated...it turned out that six of us had died, several by slow suicide in the form of heroin abuse, and at least two by faster means. I did not intend to write *Odds* when I first started telling the stories that you will read in my book. The stories began as a series of oral devotions that I gave to my fellow teachers at Carachipampa Christian School. As I shared my life through these devotionals, someone suggested that I write them down for others. I did just that during the spring of 2015. Those written devotionals became Part One of *Odds*. They take you from my childhood conversion to college to my first job and then to the mission field. There are several stops along the way including me spending time in prison and marrying someone I hardly knew. The stories that follow in Part Two, *Young and Restless*,

continue with incidents of when I was growing up and without direction for my life. They are stories from my “maturing” years. My wife and kids are still helping me mature, as related in the stories in Part Three, Family Matters. The stories in Part Four "What REALLY Happens in Ministry" give a perspective of missions that one rarely considers: ministry often happens when the Holy Spirit works in spite of us, not because of us. This is because God only recognizes one Worker, the Holy Spirit. He works and much ministry happens when we just get out of His way. The last "You Should've Been There" stories are meant to provoke your thinking about what is really important. The stories, while humorous, ponder serious themes such as what the true church is, how we silently influence others and what is truly valuable in life. The stories in Odds are true and the people mentioned in them are real. However my memory is what it is and others familiar with the story may remember things differently. I have tried to be honest in everything and not exaggerate, but I have used literary license and illustrative language to make the stories enjoyable. More than just telling a story for the sake of a story, I have tried to express in Odds that God is sovereignly overseeing our lives to bring us into conformity to his plans and purposes for us. His ultimate goal is to shape us into the image of his Son Jesus Christ. But in that process there are choices we make: Will we follow our own plans – or God's? Will we live conformed to this world or conformed to God's will and purposes for us in Jesus? I hope these my stories will encourage you to seek God's plans and walk faithfully in them. I pray that they help you see that living for Jesus is more than just living a normal life. If that happens, I will be encouraged and praise God for what he has done – The Odds are God's!
